Context for Woodberry Down Library Provision

- Feasibility study commissioned in November to scope the potential for locating a new library, financial viability, co-location options and strategic fit


Feasibility study timetable

- November/December: review of policy and data; library need/demand; mapping local services; strategic fit; spatial requirements (initial thoughts); user profiling; developing assessment matrix.
- January/February: stakeholder feedback; review of findings; financial analysis; final report.

Developing potential users profile

- Considering existing community, residents moving in, residents who are temporary
- Needs and demands for different groups; overlapping areas
- Changes over time need for flexibility

Strategic fit in the local area

- How a library could be a fit with the other activities and spaces in Woodberry Down
- Mapping local services and activities
- Local community spaces: Redmond Centre, Block D, Children's Centre, The Edge
 - o Programme, target users, character, activities, community needs





Considering three options to test the feasibility

- A whole space being used as a library
- B some of the space being let out to a suitable use (co-location)
- C some of the space being let out to a suitable use *and* some of the library space being shared with other activities (e.g. arts / performance / small business / cafe)

Assessment matrix to help decide the best options: considers strategic and community fit, social value and financial viability
